

Apprenticeships in Motor Vehicle Engineering

This Apprenticeship aims to enable learners to develop Motor Vehicle Engineering skills, and apply them in practical situations in the workplace.

The programme offers young people the opportunity to achieve National Accredited qualifications in Motor Vehicle Engineering and designated Key Skills whilst gaining practical work experience.

At the same time employers benefit from well-trained and motivated members of staff who can make a significant contribution to the company.

Apprentices follow an approved framework of training at Level 2 or Level 3 that will meet the different needs of both small and large organisations.

The framework consists of:

A National Vocational Qualification (NVQ) Level 2 or 3

NVQs are nationally recognised qualifications; they are work-based and work relevant and build on practical experience gained in the workplace.

Key Skills / Technical Certificate

- Communication
- Application of Number
- Information Technology

Key Skills are transferable skills that enhance not just the young person's contribution in the workplace but also in everyday life. An external test may require to be taken by the young person depending on GCSE grades previously achieved.

Entry requirements

All learners will have an initial assessment to determine appropriate level of qualification to be undertaken.



Content to be covered

The NVQ Level 2 in Motor Vehicle Engineering

Technical Certificates

Options include:

- Vehicle Maintenance and Repair – Light Vehicle
- Vehicle Maintenance and Repair – Heavy Vehicle
- Vehicle Body and Paint Operations – Repairer
- Vehicle Body and Paint Operations – Refinisher

NVQ Certificate

Options include:

- Vehicle Maintenance and Repair – Light Vehicle
- Vehicle Maintenance and Repair – Heavy Vehicle
- Vehicle Body and Paint Operations – Repairer
- Vehicle Body and Paint Operations – Refinisher

Staffing

Learners are regularly visited in the workplace every six weeks by Training Consultants and receive workplace assessment and observation.

Resources

- > Occupationally competent staff.
- > Inductions carried out at Prescott Street.
- > IMI accreditation with direct claim status.
- > Underpinning knowledge test centre.

Duration of programme

Negotiated for individual learners.

Suggested time frame for NVQ Level 2 – minimum of two years (dependant on young person)

Suggested time frame for NVQ Level 3 – up to 3 years (dependant on young person)

Venue

- > 1:1 coaching and assessment carried out in the workplace.
- > Training facilities, including IT Suite at Prescott Street.
- > Local college facilities.
- > Distance learning.
